

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Theory: A child is said to be fully immunized if child receives all due vaccine as per national immunization schedule within 1st year age of child. Expanded Programme on Immunization was launched in 1978. It was renamed as Universal Immunization Programme (UIP) in 1985 when its reach was expanded beyond urban areas. In 1992, it became part of Child Survival and Safe Motherhood Programme and in 1997 it was included in the ambit of National Reproductive and Child Health Programme. Since the launch of National Rural Health Mission in 2005, Universal Immunization Programme has always been an integral part of it.

Immunization: Immunization is one of the most effective and cost-effective ways to protect children's lives and futures.

Vaccine: A preparation that is used to stimulate the body's immune response against diseases. Vaccines are usually administered through needle injections.

Vaccination: Vaccination is the main tool for primary prevention of disease and one of the most cost-effective public health measures available.
